

Nursing Assistant (Secondary/High School)

This program prepares the student for an entry-level position as a nursing assistant. Emphasis is on basic patient care skills, based on the knowledge of universal precautions, asepsis, basic human needs, body mechanics, treatments and procedures, patient admission, transfer discharge, and eldercare.

Current Arizona Nursing Assistant Certification is an admission requirement to EAC's Nursing program.

Average Salary: \$24,040

Nursing (Postsecondary/ College)

This program is designed to prepare the student for beginning employment as a staff nurse giving direct care to patients. The program has received approval by the Arizona State Board of Nursing. On successful completion of the program, you will be awarded the Associate of Applied Science in Nursing degree and will be eligible to make application to write the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN).

The program permits students to enter or exit from the program based on their specific needs, space availability, and time limitations. Entry into the nursing program requires prior admission.

Average Salary: \$63,750

What is Programs of Study?

A guide for high schools, parents, and students to utilize outlining high school-to-college academic and career education coursework for various Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs funded through the Carl Perkins Grant.

The Programs of Study must lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the college level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree.

What are the Benefits?

- Students are provided a path to follow to meet their educational/career goals.
- Students may receive college credit for courses taken at the high school (i.e. dual enrollment).
- Students have the potential to earn certification, licensure, and/or a degree sooner than students who begin their educational goals after high school.
- Helps students avoid taking unnecessary college courses, saving time and money.
- Provides parents an opportunity to be involved in their child's education.
